Wiltshire Girls Advanced Coaching Centre

The Wiltshire County FA Girls Advanced Coaching Centre is now 11 weeks into its coaching programme with the girls involved continuing to develop and show what fantastic talent we have here in Wiltshire.

Following on from the training sessions at the fantastic Wellington Academy in Tidworth on Monday nights the Under 12s, Under 14s and Under 16s teams have put into practice skills developed with fixtures against both Dorset and Devon County FA's.

The fixtures provided a stern test for all age groups with the games allowing the girls from Wiltshire to test themselves against some of the best female players within the South West including current England players at U15 and U17 level. The Dorset game saw mixed results across the age groups with both counties picking up a win and a draw and the Devon game saw Wiltshire further enhance their reputation with two victories out of three games. With development being key over results the all round team performances from all age groups was the most pleasing element for coaches, parents and the players themselves and further showed that the players are developing individually and as a team.

The Centre has seen success with six girls currently in the South West Centre of Excellence which is the next level of the England Female Elite Talent Pathway. These girls attend a monthly training weekend in Taunton with other talented players across the region playing fixtures against fellow Centre of Excellences from around the Country. Girls from the centre at Under 14 and Under 16 will soon also be representing the Wiltshire Schools FA in fixtures against fellow counties to further showcase the talent on show within our County.

The introduction of an Under 10s age group who are now three weeks into their coaching programme now sees over 56 talented female players access the Advanced Coaching Centre which bodes well alongside the excellent work being undertaken by our clubs and leagues within the County of Wiltshire.

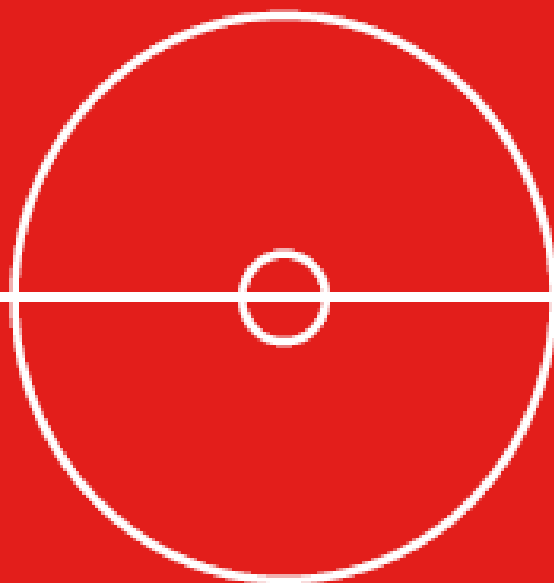

Pitch Improvement Programme

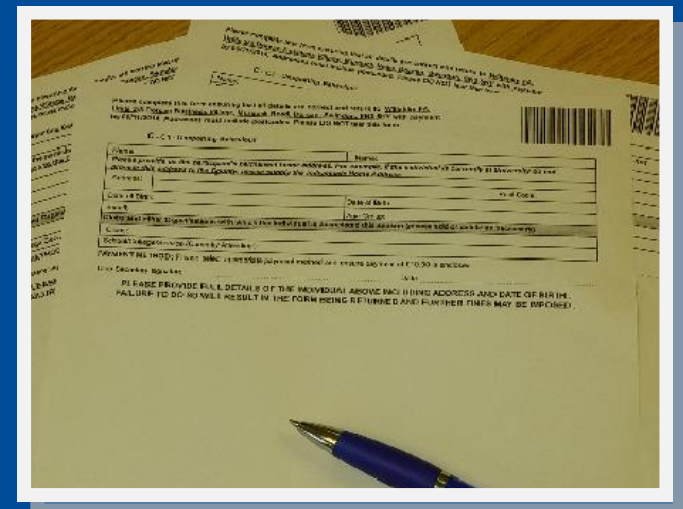

Wiltshire Sports Awards

Clubs and Individuals Recognised

This week saw the 'Wiltshire Sports Awards' ceremony take place at The Atrium, County Hall in Trowbridge with football heavily represented on the shortlist of nominees.

The awards recognise and honour the work and achievements of athletes, sports clubs, volunteers and coaches across Wiltshire Council area.

The awards are sponsored by Landmarc and were hosted jointly by Wiltshire Council, Wiltshire Health Improvement Partnership and Wiltshire and Swindon Sport with former England rugby captain, Phil de Glanville hosting the night and special guest speaker, Team GB heptathlete Kelly Sotherton. Kelly won Gold at the 2006 Commonwealth Games, and was a bronze medallist at the 2004 Olympics and 2007 World Championships.

The first award of night was for 'Most Inclusive Club of the Year' and AFC Melksham Ability Counts Football Club were winners. The community football team caters for footballers that have a range of learning and physical disabilities. As a club, inclusion for all is of paramount importance with the club offering a range of training sessions, tailored to the level and ability of their players.

Next up to be recognised as winners were Marlborough Youth Football Club in the 'Sports Club of the Year category'. Formed in 2009, the club has a total of 240 players whilst also recently creating a girls section encouraging 65 girls to sign up for a free 8 week pilot during the summer which has now created regular teams. The club have also developed online coaching resource utilising dropbox to share coaching materials, centralised administration and player registration. To enable growth the club have created partnerships with Marlborough Rugby Club and Marlborough College while the club also continue to work with the town council to find locations to play football.

The final football club award winners were Marion and Dave Pictet in the 'Long Service to Sport Award'. The couple have been involved in football for the past 50 years and with their support Malmesbury Youth Football Club was formed in 1989 and now boasts 200 players and 14 teams. Marion and Dave were also instrumental in developing a relationship with Malmesbury Football Club to create a player pathway and encourage the transition from youth to adult football in the town. All members of the club admire and respect them for their continued commitment and the couple have their names engraved on the club house wall. As well as continuing to drive the club forward, Marion and Dave have helped to secure the long term future of the club through the negotiation of a 35 year lease.

A big well done must go to all winners and shortlisted individuals and club for the awards across a variety of sports and a big thank you to Wiltshire Council, Wiltshire Health Improvement Partnership and Wiltshire and Swindon Sport for putting the awards night together.
